Established in 1975, the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery (ABFAS) is an independent, nonprofit organization dedicated to serving the public interest by promoting excellence in the art and science of podiatric surgery through board certification. ABFAS is the only certifying board for foot and ankle surgery recognized by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education.



WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE ABFAS BOARD CERTIFIED?

1 EDUCATION AND RESIDENCY

After completing an undergraduate degree and four years of doctoral training at a podiatric medical college, a podiatrist may choose a specialized residency program to obtain clinical experience as a foot and ankle surgeon.

2 BOARD CERTIFICATION PROCESS


Residents in their final year of residency training initiate the Board Certification process by taking a thorough didactic exam and a computer-based patient simulation. A candidate who passes these exams becomes Board Qualified.

The final step in board certification is a comprehensive review of a sample of the candidate's actual medical cases. Once candidates successfully complete this part of the process, they become Board Certified and earn the title of ABFAS Diplomate.

3 KEEPING BOARD CERTIFICATION

To maintain board certification, ABFAS requires Diplomates to participate in its LEAD Continuous Certification program, assessing their knowledge and skills throughout the year and demonstrating a career-long commitment to learning the latest advancements in podiatric surgery and bringing them to patient care.

Diplomates must also participate in continuing medical education activities and provide proof of current active surgical practice verified by a hospital or surgery center.

ABFAS Board Certification is recognized as the gold standard in the specialty field of foot and ankle surgery.
