Exams 101: What You Need to Know About Board Certification in Foot and Ankle Surgery



The American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery (ABFAS) is the only foot and ankle surgery certification board recognized by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education. Our two-step process of Board Qualification (Part I) and Board Certification (Part II) includes Case Review to ensure thorough clinical experience and surgical skill. Did You Know: FYITE Edition

DID YOU

KNOW?

76% of the 2023 residency class passed at least one of their Final-year In-training exams. Residents can now **count any Final-year In-training Exam** (FYITE) with a score of 500 or above as a passed Board Qualification exam.

Did you know...

- 76% of the 2023 residency class passed at least one of their October 2022 FYITEs.
- You can save up to \$725 if you pass your FYITEs.
- Don't let misinformation fool you! Most residents don't begin Reconstructive Rearfoot/Ankle Surgery (RRA) training until their third year, so a FYITE pass rate on training you have only just begun isn't intimidating—it's impressive!
- 75% of the 2023 residency class passed either the Foot Surgery Didactic and/or the Foot Surgery Computer-based Patient Simulation (CBPS) FYITE.
 43% will be ABFAS Board Qualified in Foot Surgery upon residency completion without having to take any additional Foot Surgery exams.
- 44% of the 2023 residency class passed either the RRA Surgery Didactic and/or the RRA Surgery CBPS FYITE. 16% will be Board Qualified in Foot Surgery and RRA Surgery upon residency completion based on their October FYITE performance.
- ABFAS Board Qualification enables foot and ankle surgeons to obtain initial hospital privileges and get on insurance panels immediately after residency completion


Podcast Sneak Peek: Women & ABFAS Certification
