Preparing for Your ABFAS Didactic Exam

ABFAS' Part I Board Qualification exams take place in March (Register now! Registration closes February 26, 2020). The exams consists of two formats, the C omputer-Based Patient Simulator (CBPS) and the didactic computer-adaptive (CAT) or multiple-choice exams.

What is computer-adaptive? As you answer each question, the computer assesses your response and selects the next question based on whether you answered the previous question correctly. The questions become progressively more or less difficult as the examination establishes your level of knowledge. **Preparing for Your Exam**

ABFAS provides tools for candidates to better prepare for the didactic exams. ABFAS stresses that you should become familiar with these tools, and take the

online practice exam at least once. The <u>Didactic Online Study Guide</u> contains information on exam subject areas and examples of the didactic examination questions. The online practice exam

demonstrates the types of questions to expect and the formats in which it will be presented in the didactic exams. You can access both of these tools through your StepUp Learning account (sign in using your ABFAS username and password). Refer to the ABFAS Board Qualification document if you have any questions about the Part I Board Qualification examinations.

Preparing for Your CBPS Exams

Just like for the didactic exam, ABFAS provides preparation tools for candidates

enrolled in CBPS exams. Every candidate should use these tools, and take the CBPS practice exam at least once before the Qualification examinations.

Take the Online CBPS Practice Exam The <u>CBPS practice exam</u> is designed to help you become more familiar with the functions and navigation of the exam. However, waiting until test day to learn how

the exam functions could result in lost time and frustration.

It is very important to become familiar with the following functions before test day: Searching the list of selections. Making selections.

· Navigating from tab to tab. · Viewing and zooming images.

- Access to the CBPS practice exam is unlimited and the more times you practice, the more familiar you will become with the user interface and how the CBPS system

responds to entries. This will save you time on each case and will allow you to focus on the content of the case and not how the exam works.

Since there are a limited number of choices, it is important to be very specific to demonstrate that you have the ability and knowledge to manage the case in an appropriate manner.

Common CBPS Mistakes to Avoid <u>Jumping to a Diagnosis and Treatment</u> A common mistake made on the CBPS exam is to jump to a diagnosis and move to treatment without providing evidence that the diagnosis and treatment were selected in a thoughtful manner. For example, seeing an image of a patient with a bunion and deciding to take an x-ray and then do a procedure would be a mistake. We need to know that you performed an appropriate case-focused physical examination. This must be demonstrated by selecting the physical examination

options that relate specifically to the problem presented and/or support the

determination of a diagnosis and treatment plan, where applicable.

Working up the patient to prepare the patient for surgery is not the purpose of the examination. The purpose is to come up with a diagnosis and a treatment plan that is

Not Providing a Case-focused Work-up

to determine if you need any additional evidence for the diagnosis and treatment of the case. It is important to focus on the management of the case, not the surgical work-up. For additional CBPS resources, including instructions for the CBPS Practice Exam click here.
